Botanical Drawing I and II with Amanda Ahmed Term 2, 2025 QHub Auditorium 49-55 Hesse Street, Queenscliff

Class Description:

This structured class is designed for beginners to intermediate students, offering the choice to focus on drawing with either graphite or coloured pencil. While students with limited experience are encouraged to begin with graphite before progressing to coloured pencil, this is not mandatory.

New students will learn the fundamentals of botanical drawing, including form, tone, various markmaking techniques, and how to recognize and translate basic geometric shapes found in nature into their drawings. More experienced students will explore advanced coloured pencil techniques and colour theory.

At both levels, the emphasis is on observational drawing from life to create realistic botanical renderings. The class is conducted in a friendly and supportive environment, making it ideal for those who have completed an introduction to botanical art or wish to develop and refine their drawing skills.

Outcomes:

At the end of the term, you will have built up a series of sketches and studies in your drawing book and completed at least one fully rendered drawing in either graphite or coloured pencil. You will have developed more confidence in drawing from life and a good understanding of basic graphite and coloured pencil techniques.

Class structure:

During the term, the following will be covered:

- 1. Practicing hand-eye coordination with a series of drawing exercises.
- 2. Reviewing basics of drawing using 3- line technique and learn about other geometric tools to assist with drawing natural forms.
- 3. Learning graphite pencil applications and techniques.
- 4. Learning different coloured pencil applications and techniques.
- 5. Explore tone, form and light with graphite and coloured pencil to create realistic 3D effects.
- 6. Review.

Time will be set aside to review work, provide feedback, discuss progress, and answer questions.

Class dates: 8, 22 May; 5, 19 June; 3 July

Class times: 10am-3.30pm with 30 mins for lunch

Drawing I and II Materials

For both levels:

- 1. Graphite pencils 4H, 2H, H, B, HB, 2B, 4B (Staedtler Mars Lumograph this is the preferred brand but if you have another brand already use that) (Art supplier/also try Officeworks)
- 2. Kneadable rubber (Art supplier)
- 3. Tombow Mono Zero Eraser fine tipped pen style eraser, (Art supplier/ Officeworks)
- 4. A3 cartridge paper drawing pad must be smooth surface (Art supplier/Officeworks)
- Graphite only students: Arches watercolour paper 300gsm hot pressed smooth 1 x sheet (Art supplier). Please keep flat and cut into 4 x sheets. Do not purchase Arches watercolour pad as a substitute. Note: will require a plastic sleeve with cardboard to store the paper.
- 6. Clear plastic ruler 15-20cm long (Officeworks/Art Suppliers)
- 7. Tracing paper 2 x A3 or A2 sheets (not pad is expensive) (Art supplier/maybe Officeworks)
- Hand-held flat surface magnifying glass (must have) (Post Office, Officeworks, Art supplier, Online magnifying glass supplier)
